

Celso Arango, MD, PhD

Celso Arango currently holds the position of Associate Professor of Psychiatry at the Maryland Psychiatric Research Center, Maryland, USA and Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at the Complutense University in Madrid, Spain. He is also Head of the Psychiatric Adolescent Unit at the “Gregorio Marañón” General University Hospital in Madrid. His research interests include early onset psychosis, neuroimaging in schizophrenia, and violence in schizophrenia.

Dr Arango completed his doctoral thesis in 1997, the same year in which he won the Young Scientist Award at the 9th Biennial Winter Workshop on Schizophrenia. In 1998 he was selected for the American Psychiatric Research Colloquium for Junior Investigators (Neuroimaging), in 1999 he received the Stanley Foundation award for work on the prediction and prevention of violence in outpatient schizophrenia. He received in 2005 an independent investigator award from the NARSAD. Dr Arango has published more than 60 peer review articles, more than 20 book chapters and edited 4 books. He is the Coordinator of the Spanish Network in Early Onset Psychosis funded by the Department of Health.
