SCIENTIFIC BIOGRAPHY

Javier Benitez, PhD in Human Genetics, Madrid (1982). Benitez spent several years at the Hospital La Paz and Fundación Jimenez Díaz (both in Madrid) where he was Head of the Human Genetics Service. He moved to the Spanish National Cancer Research Center (CNIO) in 2000 as Director of the Human Genetics Dptm and in 2005 he was appointed as Director of the Human Cancer Genetics Program. He has been President of the Spanish Society of Human Genetics, Professor of Human Genetics at the Fco Victoria University (Madrid) and Autonoma University, author of more than 350 international publications and supervisor of 21 PhD students. Since 2004 he is also Director of the Spanish National Genotyping Centre at Madrid and principal investigator of the Unit 706 at CIBERER (Network of Research on Rare Diseases). He did short stays as postdoc in Ulm (Germany, 1985) and Amsterdam (NL, 1990), and as visiting scientist at the Royal Marsden Hospital (London, 2004) and at the Irving Cancer Research Centre (Columbia University, NY, 2009). His current work is focused in the study of familial cancer, the search of high, moderate and low susceptibility genes, and the development of high throughput technologies.
